SNOW WORRIES

The 2015-2016 winter season is upon us. The Service Department's winter equipment is ready to handle any snowy conditions that Mother Nature delivers. The Village of South Russell and its Service Department takes pride in keeping our roadways clear and safe during the winter months.

Please keep a few things in mind this winter:

- A snow Parking Ban will be declared whenever there is two or more inches of snow on any village street or the National Weather Service forecasts a severe snowstorm warning. Parking **is not** allowed on any streets in the community during a ban to make sure the streets are open for snow-plowing. This Parking Ban is in effect from November 15th through April 15th. Violators are subject to vehicles being ticketed or towed. - With the holiday season upon us, residents may be having social events at their homes. The snow removal crews will work their best to maintain passable roads although cars may be parked on the roadway. Vehicles should be parked on the same side of the road and <u>not</u> in the cul-de-sacs. All night and overnight parking without previous approval from the South Russell Police Department is prohibited and may result in early morning towing of a vehicle.
- For private snow removal, please be reminded that no person shall cause any snow to be moved from any premises, drive, parking area or sidewalk, onto or to be placed upon any portion of the traveled surface of any public street within South Russell Village, including pushing or mechanically blowing snow across Village streets. All hydrants must be free of snow as well.
- ◆ Weekly trash pickup containers must be placed off the road surface and to one side of your driveway apron. <u>Do not place containers in the roadway.</u>
- Residents should inspect the condition of their mailbox and post. The box should be secure to the post and the post should be secure in the ground. The village is NOT responsible for repairs or replacement of damaged mailboxes due to snow coming off the plows.

Safe Winter Driving

It's that time of year again. Winter is approaching in Northeast Ohio and can bring challenging driving conditions. At the South Russell Police Department, we want our residents to stay safe in these conditions so we have provided some winter driving tips from the American Automobile Association and the National Highway Transportation and Safety Administration:

Be Prepared

- Maintain Your Car. Check the battery, tire tread, windshield wipers, keep your windows clear, put no-freeze fluid in the washer reservoir, and check your antifreeze.
- Store a flashlight, jumper cables, abrasive material (sand, kitty litter, even floor mats), shovel, snow brush and ice scraper, warning devices (like flares) and blankets. *For long trips, add* food and water, medication and a cell phone.
- Stopped or stalled? Stay in your car, don't overexert, put bright markers on the antenna or windows and shine the dome light. If you run your car, clear the exhaust pipe and run it just enough to stay warm.
- Plan your route: Allow plenty of time (check the weather and leave early if necessary), be familiar with the maps/directions, and let others know your route and arrival time. If you really don't have to go out, don't.

Winter Weather Driving

- Steer into a skid.
- Know what your brakes will do: stomp on antilock brakes, pump on non-antilock brakes.
- Drive slowly. Everything takes longer on snow-covered roads. Accelerating, stopping, turning nothing happens as quickly as on dry pavement. Give yourself time to maneuver by driving slowly.
- The normal dry pavement following distance of three to four seconds should be increased to eight to ten seconds, or longer if necessary. This increased margin of safety will provide the longer distance needed if you have to stop.

If you see leaves at the street in your neighborhood, they were most likely put there by a privately hired landscaping company that will be back to pick them up. Leaves brought to the roadside by residents or landscapers must remain on tree lawns and off the roadway. Residents should make sure that leaves are cleared of and not blocking storm drains, driveway culvert pipes and ditches that could cause backups and minor flooding issues during heavy rains.

An Announcement from Dominion East Ohio

Everyone should know the signs of a natural gas leak:

- SMELL To help you smell a leak from a natural gas line or appliance, a familiar odor similar to sulfur or rotten eggs is added to natural gas.
- SEE Near a gas leak, you might see blowing dirt, bubbling water or an unusual area of dead vegetation.
- **HEAR** A leaking pipeline might make a hissing sound you can hear.

If you smell natural gas in your home, leave immediately and contact Dominion East Ohio's emergency number. Do not switch on or off any lights, electrical appliances or equipment. Do not try to locate the leak or use a phone (even a cell phone) within the house. If you call Dominion after hours, a recording will tell you the offices are closed. If you stay on the line, 24-hour emergency personnel will take your call. At a safe distance from your home, watch for the Dominion truck to let the service representative into the house.

Seniors, 60 years of age or older, living in South Russell Village and wishing to have a pickup scheduled on Senior Trash Collection Day must be registered by calling the Geauga County Department on Aging between the hours of 8:00 am -4:30 pm at 440-279-2130, or 440-564-7131 ext. 2130 or 440-834-1856 ext. 2130.

This spring pickup is on a first-come, first-serve basis, and the number of senior residents that can be served is limited. Seniors must be registered with the Department on Aging prior to pickup and must be home the day of the pickup, or have someone 18 years of age or older that is appointed by the senior, present to sign a release for the collection. Only 10 household items will be accepted per home.

Building Permit Reminder

With springtime approaching, the Building Department is asked all kinds of questions about permits and finding contractors. While permits are usually not required for repairs, any replacement such as a furnace, airconditioner, roof, hot water tank, siding, and windows do require permits as well as inspections. Other work requiring permits are decks, fences, sheds, electrical work, additions, and interior remodeling. Even when homeowners do the work themselves, permits are still required. Safety is always the primary concern, especially with the mechanical systems and electrical work. A secondary concern comes when homeowners try to sell their home, as buyers often ask to see the permit taken for the work that was done.

The Building Department can also be a valuable resource for finding reputable contractors, surveyors and architects, allowing residents to get several quotes and compare prices.

ATTENTION RESIDENTS



Municipal income tax returns are due April 18, 2016 due to Emancipation Day being observed on April 15th. All residents over 18 years of age are required to file an annual return with the Central Collection Agency (CCA). Local income tax withheld by your employer does not fulfill your obligation to file a tax return. Local ordinance provides for both penalty and interest charges to be assessed for late filing or non-filing.

<u>Retired residents</u> are required to file the **Annual Exemption** Certificate each year.

Beware of Tax Scams

From the South Russell Police Department Detective Bureau

During the tax season, tax scams are on the rise. Here are a few tips to help you avoid being a victim of a tax scam. Telephone tax scams are the most popular form of scam and the IRS has a formal process in place to assist people with their taxes. The IRS respects taxpayers' rights and does not engage in angry, shake down, harassing, or threatening style telephone calls and does not use unsolicited email, text message, or any social media to discuss your personal tax issues.

IRS will never ~

- The IRS will never call you and demand immediate payment. The IRS will also never call about taxes owed without first mailing you a bill. If you receive a phone call from someone claiming to work for the IRS it's probably a scam.
- The IRS will never demand you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- The IRS will never require you to use a specific payment form for your taxes such as a prepaid debit card.
- The IRS will never ask for credit card or debit card numbers over the phone.
- The IRS will never threaten to bring in local law enforcement officials to have you arrested for not paying your taxes. The IRS will not threaten you with an arrest warrant or tell you an arrest warrant has been issued.

Remember, if someone calls you and states they are from the Internal Revenue Service, <u>NEVER</u> give them personal information such as your date of birth or social security number. Contact the IRS at 800-829-1040 or visit IRS.gov for additional questions or concerns.

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NO PARKING ZONES

On January 11, 2016, Village Council passed an ordinance establishing "No Parking Zones" within the Village of South Russell. In addition to our existing "No Parking Zones," portions of Manorbrook Drive and Alderwood Trail have been added due to safety concerns of limited sight distance and sharp curves in particular sections of roadway.

The specific areas are as follows:


No Parking on Alderwood Trail from Bell Road to Manorbrook Drive on both sides of the street.

Landscape trailers and vehicles parked on the curves have caused motorists to drive left of center creating a danger of a head-on collision. We are asking that residents instruct their landscapers, contractors, or visitors to park on the cul-de-sac streets off Alderwood Trail.

No Parking on Manorbrook Drive east bound in front of 525 and west bound in front of 532.

We are asking that residents instruct their landscapers, contractors, or visitors to park on the opposite side of the roadway from the no parking zones on Manorbrook Drive.

New signs will be erected in the spring to indicate the specific areas addresses above.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT



In 1980, the Village of South Russell implemented a full-time, state certified Building Department. The Building and Zoning Department is located at the southeast corner of Bell and Chillicothe Road.

The Building Department answers questions about permits and finding contractors. Residential Security Assessment

In our continuing efforts to engage with the community and provide a proactive approach to crime reduction, the South Russell Police Department has initiated a residential security assessment program for South Russell residents. A residential security assessment consists of an on-site security evaluation of the residence by a South Russell Police Officer using current industry best practices and an assessment templet provided by the American Crime Prevention Institute (ACPI).

During the assessment, the officer will focus on simple, target hardening actions the homeowner can take to enhance the security of their property. Once completed, the homeowner will receive a detailed report outlining the specific recommendations.

The Village of South Russell will have a levy <u>renewal</u> on the November 8th ballot. A levy renewal maintains, but does not increase taxes. A renewal of the 1976 levy will continue to provide \$173,000 a year to the Operating Fund.
