# Winter Reminders

The 2016-2017 winter season is here and the Service Department's equipment is ready to handle any snowy conditions that Mother Nature delivers! The Village takes pride in keeping our roadways clear and safe during the winter months and asks for your assistance by keeping the following things in mind:

- A snow Parking Ban will be declared between November 15<sup>th</sup> through April 15<sup>th</sup> whenever there are two or more inches of snow on any village street or the National Weather Service forecasts a severe snowstorm warning. Parking is <u>NOT</u> allowed on <u>any</u> street in the community during a ban to make sure the streets are open for plowing.
- When having social events over the holiday season, all vehicles should be parked on the same side of the road and <u>NOT</u> in the cul-de-sacs. All overnight parking without previous approval from the Police Department is prohibited and may result in early morning towing.
- Weekly trash pickup containers must be placed off the road surface and to one side of your driveway apron. Do not place containers in the roadway.
- When plowing or shoveling snow from driveways or sidewalks, <u>do not push or blow snow</u> <u>across Village streets</u>. All hydrants must be free of snow as well.

# Winter Weather Driving Tips

Steer into a skid.

Know what your brakes will do: *stomp* on *antilock brakes, pump* on *non-antilock* brakes.



Drive slowly. Everything takes longer on snow-covered roads. Accelerating, stopping, turning—nothing happens as quickly as on dry pavement. Give yourself time to maneuver by driving slowly.

The normal dry pavement following distance of three to four seconds should be increased to eight to ten seconds, or longer if necessary. This increased margin of safety will provide the longer distance needed if you have to stop.

#### **Bell Road East Gas Line**



Did you drive through the east end of Bell Road lately and wonder what was going on?

Dominion East Ohio Gas is installing new, larger pipeline along Bell Road from Paw Paw Lake Drive to Chillicothe Road. The new line will supplement the present line providing improved service to residents. The Village thanks everyone for their patience with the construction zone as it moves its way along Bell Road.

#### Renewal of Levy

Thanks to the support of our residents, the 1976 Operating levy passed by 75%! This renewal does not raise taxes but will continue to bring in \$173,000 per year to the Operating Fund. The Village will continue to be good stewards of your tax dollars.

#### Bell Road Gas Station Update

The sale of the Bell Road gas station should be finalized soon. Once the sale is complete, the station and the underground storage tanks will be removed and replaced by a new facility and tanks. The expected opening of the new facility is May 2017.

## NOPEC Update

Beginning January 1, 2017 the Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council's (NOPEC) new service provider will be NextEra Energy Services of Ohio.

By this point in time, all residents should have received an opt-out mailing from NOPEC for electric service providers. This opt-out reminder is a requirement of the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio (PUCO) to remind residents every three years of who their service provider is and let them know they have the right to choose their own utility service providers. Residents wishing to remain with NOPEC don't have to do anything and their service will continue with NOPEC with NextEra being the new electric service provider.

# TAXES DUE AND PREPARATION ASSISTANCE IS BEING OFFERED!

Municipal income tax returns are due April 18, 2017 due to Emancipation Day. All residents 18 years of age and older are required to file an annual return with the Central Collection Agency (CCA). Local income tax withheld by your employer does not fulfill your obligation to file a tax return. Local ordinance provides for both penalty and interest charges to be assessed for late filing or non-filing.

#### <u>Retired residents</u> are required to file the Annual Exemption Certificate each year.

The Central Collection Agency (CCA) will be on-site at Village Hall, 5205 Chillicothe Road on **Friday, April 7th from 4-7 p.m**. to assist taxpayers in completing their local returns. This assistance is offered free on a walk-in basis; no appointments will be taken. #### Many Home Projects Require Permits

With springtime approaching, the Building Department is asked all kinds of questions about permits and finding contractors. While permits are usually not required for repairs, any replacement such as a furnace, air-conditioning, roof, hot water tank, siding, and windows do require permits, and do require inspections. Other work requiring permits are decks, fences, sheds, electrical work, additions, and interior remodeling. Even when homeowners do the work themselves, permits are still required. Safety is always our primary concern, especially with the mechanical systems and electrical work. In addition, a secondary concern comes when you try to sell your home, and buyers ask us whether a permit was issued for the work that was done. We can also be a valuable resource for finding reputable contractors, surveyors and architects. We are able to provide you with a few names so you can compare prices. #### IT WILL BE A CLEAN SWEEP FOR SOUTH RUSSELL VILLAGE

As spring approaches, scheduling of the annual street sweeping has been set to begin around **Monday**, **April 17**<sup>th</sup>, **2017**. Sweeping will only continue if weather permits and large amounts of rainwater are not present.

All Village streets, cul-de-sacs and turnarounds will be swept to remove winter debris. If your street has a current gravel berm, this material can be used as fill in low areas and around mailboxes. On these streets, the material should not be placed on the hard asphalt road surface. If the grass line of your yard meets the edge of the road, material may be raked onto the first foot of road surface. This will allow the sweeper to clean up while maintaining a neat grass edge line. No additional material is acceptable such as limbs or yard waste.

While property and yard cleanup is taking place, it is a good time to inspect your ditch lines and driveway culvert pipes. These are the responsibility of each homeowner to maintain and should be kept clear of leaves, limbs and tall grasses. Leaf piles and debris such as old newspapers in plastic bags should not be in the Village right-of-way ditches as they may cause blockages. No standing water should be present.



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#### Who to Contact in a Power Outage

Along with warmer weather come storms which sometimes cause power outages. In the event of a power outage, it is important for residents to report their outage directly to First Energy. The utility company gauges outages based on the number of outage reports it receives. If only one person on a street reports an outage, the utility company may think only one person is affected. However, if everyone on the street being affected reports the outage, they will know more people are being affected and schedule repairs appropriately. The best way to submit a power outage is through the First Energy website or the app which can both be found at: *www.firstenergycorp.com/outages\_help.html* Outages can also be reported by calling: 1-888-544-4877.

The First Energy app is also a great way to see what areas are currently experiencing outages, how many people are being affected, as well as to check on the status of an outage.

Stormwater Update

Over the past year the Village held several meetings with residents, did multiple tours and a lot of research regarding stormwater issues in the Village. During heavy rains some residents have water entering one door and exiting another. Given the water issues in the Village, Council approved an expenditure of \$12,000 to CT Consultants, (the Village's engineering firm), to do a stormwater study of the area north of Bell Road, east of Chillicothe Road, south of Russell Township and west of Belmeadow in an attempt to develop a solution to the storm water problems in that area. Village elected officials will continue to work towards finding a solution to these problems.

## **Changes at the Intersection**

Changes continue at the intersection of Bell Road and Chillicothe Road. The white farmhouse is now the site of an insurance company and the dentist's office currently located at the corner lot is moving just north of the new insurance office. The corner gas station will be replaced with a new gas station in the near future and the red barn just east of the insurance building is the future site of a table refinishing business.

in which Police Officers conduct security checks of your property while you're away. Simply contact the Police Department at 440-338-7611 or use the online form to request your residence be placed on the watch list. Officers will visually and physically check your doors and windows to ensure security, and inspect for damage, tampering, or signs of unusual activity. When you return, a log of the officer's checks and any activity noted can be emailed to you or picked up at the Police Department.



## Fireworks and the Law

As the Fourth of July holiday is fast approaching, we would like to remind all residents about the use of fireworks within the Village limits.

While fireworks are fun to watch, they do pose a hazard to not only the shooter, but also the spectators and the surrounding area. They can cause serious injury and even death to the shooter and/or spectators. If the area is dry, the hot ashes could ignite a brush fire. These same hot ashes can also set homes on fire as well.

Our current Ohio State Fire Code does not allow for any type of fireworks to be shot off within the State of Ohio with the exception of sparklers and snakes. All other types of fireworks require a permit from the State Fire Marshal's office as well as a licensed technician to set them off. In addition to the proper permit, there must be a fire official present and fire protection readily available.

The Village asks everyone to refrain from using any illegal fireworks for everyone's personal safety. Any firework complaints will be investigated by the Police Department which will lead to confiscation of all illegal fireworks in your possession and a citation could be served for the illegal activity.



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### **Garage Sale Information**

Thinking about having a garage sale? The Village does not require permits for garage sales; however, it does limit sales to two (2) per year and the sale cannot last any longer than four (4) consecutive days.

## What's Happening on Bell Road?

In the area of Bell Road west, where the 2014 widening project took place, there was poor quality restoration by the contractor. Realizing that residents have had to put up with this inferior work for almost three years, the Village decided to do the restoration work in-house. We hope to finalize the project in 2018.

Landscaping continues along the gas line project completed in late 2016 on Bell Road east. The additional gas line began in the Silver Springs/Paw Paw Lake area and ended at Chillicothe Road. The Village is requiring the contractor to return and address inadequately restored yards and driveways. It is expected that this work will be completed in the coming weeks.

## **Storm Water Issues**

The Village is working with Chagrin River Watershed Partners to develop plans to reduce the speed of water that flows from the Family Life Center into Chagrin Lakes, the speed of water from Kensington Green through the Village complex into Chagrin Lakes, the Cascades Drive culvert situation in Lake Louise, and the flooding of homes east of Chillicothe Road and north of Bell Road.

In addition, the Village has contracted with CT Consultants to prepare the Chillicothe Road North Central Drainage Study which is a storm water plan for the area north of Bell Road.

Elected officials know stormwater issues continue to be a concern for the Village and are working on developing a plan to address these problems.
