#### **Projects Around the Village**

Projects both big and small continue around the Village. The long awaited paving of Bell Rd. east will be delayed until next year due to NOACA funding.

In an effort to further address storm water issues, the Village sought and will be receiving funding to address the Hemlock Rd. culvert which affects residents in the Chagrin Heights area. This project is scheduled to go out to bid after July 1<sup>st</sup>.

On the Village campus, designbuild bids have been received and reviewed for the salt dome replacement project. The Police Department garage project is nearly complete.

Council also approved funding for a tree replacement study to potentially plant screening around the Central Retention Basin and other campus locations, as well as a trail study to determine areas that would be conducive to establishing trails.

Last but not least, the South Russell Village Park finally has its very own restroom facility for all those who visit the playground, picnic at the pavilion, hike the park, etc.

# Summer Storm Information Severe Weather and Storm Precautions

Tornado warnings are issued by the National Weather Service Office. As severe weather develops this season, keep in mind that a tornado **watch** means the conditions are favorable and a **warning** means that a tornado is **imminent**, **occurring**, **or expected to develop** 

If a tornado warning is issued in Geauga County, the Geauga County Sheriff's Office will activate our tornado siren. The siren is tested each Saturday at 2:00 p.m. and sounds for about 30 seconds. When there is a real alert, it will last 3 minutes.

Summer storms can produce high winds, lightning, and torrential rain resulting in yard and home damage and flooding. Although it may not be possible to completely avoid storm damage, there are precautions that may help mitigate the extent of it. The Ohio Committee for Severe Weather Awareness recommends cutting down or trimming trees that may be in danger of falling onto your home. Additionally, clean/clear your drains and gutters. Clogs force rainwater over the edge of the gutters causing water to run down the sides of the home, down the foundation, and into the basement through even the smallest of cracks.

If there are right-of-way ditches on the property, inspect them for debris to include leaves, limbs, tall grasses, old newspapers, planter pots, plastic bags, etc. that can clog them and prevent the flow of water. Likewise, for driveway culvert pipes, ensure that they are kept clear.

For homes with sump pumps, the average life of this equipment is seven to ten years. It is also important to check the battery backup! And don't forget to inspect floor drains to make sure they are operating properly.

More extensive precautions may include extending downspouts to flow away from the home, re-grading the yard, installing window well coverings, repairing foundation cracks, and foundation waterproofing.

It is also recommended to consider surge protectors, lightning rods, or a lightning protection system to safeguard your home, appliances, and electronics.

Lastly, it is important to have a plan and to build an emergency kit for your home and vehicle.
