It was ten years ago, July 18, 2015, when then-Mayor Matt Brett opened the new cemetery on Chillicothe Road. Now 25% full, the Cemetery Committee of Cindy Nairn, Patty Mills, and Ed Pyle worked for seven years to make a dream become a reality. In August, the former committee and past and present Village officials celebrated the success of the cemetery.

The Safe Bicycle and Pedestrian Transport Committee continues to work with Council to achieve its goal of a 5' asphalt path on the north side of Bell Rd. from the Bell/Chillicothe intersection to Spring Drive in Country Estates. The path would be in the right-of-way separated from the road by a grass area.



# From the Building Department

If you have had work performed on your house within the past three years and would like the Village's copy of the plans, please contact the Building and Zoning Department by emailing us at building@southrussell.com, or calling 440-338-1312. The deadline for notifying us of your intent to pick up the plans is **October 15**, **2025**. All residential construction or remodeling plans three years or older, and not picked up, will be destroyed by **November 15**, **2025**.

#### Fall Leaves

The Village of South Russell does not offer curbside leaf collection service. If you see leaves at the edge of a street in your neighborhood, they were most likely put there by a privately hired landscaping company that will be back to pick them up. Leaves brought to the roadside by residents or landscapers must remain on the property and off the roadway. Residents should make sure that leaves are cleared and do not block storm drains, driveway culvert pipes, and ditches which could cause backups and flooding issues during heavy rains.

Previously, eblasts were sent by the Village to relay time sensitive information to residents. Instead, the TextMyGov service is now being utilized to communicate important information. Many of you have opted in to TextMyGov, but in order to take advantage of the geofencing feature of the service, more information is needed from **SOME** residents. Geofencing allows the Village to send texts to specific neighborhoods and/or areas that may be impacted by power outages, downed trees, road closures, etc. A letter from the Village was sent to those homes that are not currently enrolled in geofencing. The letter provides the steps to sign up. If you are interested in receiving notifications and/or alerts for your specific neighborhood or uncertain as to whether you are already included, please follow the link: https://southrussell.com/text to register. #### **Draining Pools**

In past years, it has come to the attention of the Building Department that some pool owners drain their pools onto neighboring properties. This can result in issues and damage for these property owners. As the end of pool season approaches, it is respectfully requested that all pool owners take extra care to avoid this when draining some, or all, of their pool water. The South Russell Police Department wants to encourage the safe use of electric bicycles and scooters by our residents traveling on our roadways! Electric bikes and scooters have become a more common means of getting around the neighborhoods or traveling longer distances within our Village limits – especially amongst kids! That being said, did you know that you must be **16 years of age** to legally ride a Class 3 E-Bike in the State of Ohio? Check the E-Bike status on the frame of your bike to make sure you're following the law! Additionally, the Consumer Product Safety Commission recommends that children between the ages of 9 and 12 do not operate a vehicle that can travel over 10mph!

All e-bikes can reach speeds up to 20 mph, with Class 3 e-bikes able to reach 28 mph. Likewise, electric scooters typically operate between 15 mph and 25 mph. E-bikes and e-scooters leverage pedal-assist and hand throttle features to reach these speeds seamlessly with less physical effort, and sometimes we may not even realize how fast we're traveling while riding them. Riders should be aware of the correlation between higher speeds and an increased risk of injury in the event of an accident. So, it is important that we observe safe riding practices, including:

- 1. Wear your helmet always!
- 2. Ride without headphones so you can hear traffic, pedestrians, and other riders around vou.
- 3. Follow traffic laws when you are operating on the roadway!
- 4. Wear reflective clothing, especially in the early morning or after dark.
- 5. Be mindful of weather and roadway conditions, such as wet roadways, sun glare, sharp turns, or steep grades!



The General Election will take place on November 4, 2025. Voter registration deadline is October 6, 2025. The polls are open on Election Day from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. and South Russell residents vote at Gurney School.

For the option of absentee voting, the registration deadline is seven days before election day. The absentee ballot must be received by the Board of Elections before 7:30 p.m. on November 4th to be counted.
