#### From the Mayor:

Thanks to residents for their patience when the first snow storm of the year struck early in the morning. With two of our drivers out for medical issues, our remaining drivers did the best they could to achieve the standards we expect. If a blizzard would occur, we have arrangements with surrounding communities to help us.

Thanks to Chagrin Valley Fire Department Fire Marshal and Iraqi War veteran Jim Finley who spoke to the thirty-eight veterans who attended the third annual Veterans' Luncheon.

Thanks to all who helped with the distribution/cost of wreaths at the graves of the veterans buried in one of our two cemeteries as a part of the Wreaths Across America program. The Rarick Cemetery on Bell Road contains the remains of a veteran of the War of 1812.

Thanks to the Cats Den Garden Club for planting 1,000 daffodil bulbs at the SRV Cemetery on Chillicothe Road. Last year they planted 1,000 daffodil bulbs at the park.

Thanks to the Chagrin Falls Masonic Temple for donating a flagpole recently installed in the East Washington side of the South Russell Village Park.

A total solar eclipse will occur on Monday, April 8th, 3:13 p.m. Send your ideas on how residents can be part of the event to mayor@southrussell.com.

There will be a special Council meeting on Tuesday, January 9th, 7:00 p.m. to gather residents' comments about possible crosswalks, sidewalks, and paths. Crosswalks have been suggested from Sugar Bush to Gurney School, Alderwood Dr. to the park, and across East Washington St. by the restaurants. Sidewalks have been suggested for the Rolling Ridge neighborhood. A multi-purpose path is under consideration along Bell to improve access to the park from Chillicothe Rd. to Daisy Ln. A survey related to the original proposed crosswalk location at Bell Road at Sugarbush Lane can be accessed at <a href="https://www.southrussell.com/crosswalk">www.southrussell.com/crosswalk</a>.

At the Council meeting on November 29th, Council voted to suspend collection of one mill for one year from the 1.5 mill Roads and Bridges levy to softened the higher property taxes coming in 2024 as a result of the higher appraisal values of our homes. Instead of an "average" increase of \$140 on Village taxes, residents will see an increase of an "average" of \$23. Please remember the Village receives 10 cents from every tax dollar. County and school taxes make up the vast majority of residents' property taxes.

#### **Homestead Exemption**

The Homestead Exemption provides a tax credit on the first \$25,000 of market value of your home. In Geauga County, the credit will average approximately \$456 in Real Estate Tax savings per year. To qualify for the Homestead Credit, you must be 65 years of age by December 31, 2021, or older or permanently disabled, occupying your home as your primary residence, and meet the income requirement. To apply for the Homestead Exemption, fill out the application found at <a href="https://auditor.geauga.oh.gov/real-estate/homestead-exemption">https://auditor.geauga.oh.gov/real-estate/homestead-exemption</a> and mail to 231 Main St., Suite 1A, Chardon, OH 44024. #### **Winter Reminders**







The Village Snow Emergency Parking Ban runs from November 15th through April 15th when there is a prediction or accumulation of two or more inches of snow.

Regarding snow removal, privately contracted snowplow drivers should keep the snow on the customer's property and should not push snow onto properties across the street or into roadways. Additionally, please keep garbage cans out of the roadway to facilitate the plowing of your street.

If heating up your car in the morning, keep your car locked! If available, use a remote start feature instead of having keys in the ignition.

For our First Responders, check that address numbers are clearly marked on the mailbox to aid in locating your residence in case of an emergency. If your mailbox is located across the street from your home, please be sure to have numbers visible on your house.

#### 🥵 Municipal Income Taxes

Municipal income tax returns for the Village of South Russell are due **April 15, 2024**. All residents 18 years of age and older are required to file an annual return with the Central Collection Agency (CCA). Local income tax withheld by your employer does not fulfill your obligation to file a tax return.

**Retired residents** are **required** to file the Annual Exemption Certificate each year.

Individual Estimates are due April 15th, June 15th, September 15th and January 15th. For the tax year 2023, 90% of the tax due must be paid by January 15, 2024 to avoid penalty and interest (subject to municipal ordinance).



#### Centennial Wrap Up



Our Centennial South Russell year winds down.

There were changes during my Dad's lifetime here, 1920-1972; great road improvement, the subdivisions of Bellwood, Lake Louise, Bel Meadow, Rolling Ridge and Maple Hill. Between 1950-1960 the population quadrupled from 349 to 1,276. It was still probable to drive Bell Rd. in the evening and only pass one or two cars. Dad wouldn't believe the changes in the last half-century....

In 1970 the traffic light was installed at Rt. 306 and Bell Rd., necessitating Rt. 306 travelers to stop for the first time. For months afterward, folks still stopped at the Bell Rd. approach to 306, accustomed to the STOP sign, and not the traffic light.

From my perch at the school bus window 1958-1970, I took in sights that remain in memory.

1966--Frank Book farm, 1101 Bell Rd, requisitioned by 'condemnation' by the CF Board of Ed. to build Gurney School., the remainder to Fox Run subdivision, c. 1994.

1970--Homes fronting Sun Ridge Lane begun; subdivision, 1981.

c. 1979--Strip mall shops, Bank built near Southwest corner of Rt. 306 and Bell Rd.

1979--Horn's Flying School and Airport closed and sold, a calamity of skyrocketing fuel prices.

Subsequently followed by Kensington Green subdivision, 1985.

1980--Rickelman farm, 5084 Chillicothe, became Manor Brook condos, Whitetail subdivision.

1990--Roy Matthews farm, 1508 Bell Rd.(Green/Rarick) sold, Bramble Farms subdivision followed.

1999--The Kingswood Gun Club (target shooting) sold, Ashleigh subdivision developed.

c. 2017--Old Ozell McLaughlin farmstead, 5277 Chillicothe Rd., became the

Chagrin Valley Lantern, preserving the barn and stately old home.

#### **House Watch Program**

As South Russell Village has welcomed many new residents in recent years, we wanted to highlight the Vacation Watch program provided by the police department.

For a quick holiday getaway or an extended trip, residents can register their houses on our Vacation Watch program by visiting southrussell.com. A link to registering your home is located on the homepage under Police Services. You will be redirected to our Frontline homepage. Select "Submit Now" under Vacation Watch to create an entry. This entry can include details to help officers checking the property, such as identifying whether there are alarm systems, pets, and vehicles that will be present at the home during the time away. Additionally, homeowners can note whether any contract work will be done during their absence and provide contact information for people who may be at the property.

The service includes physical checks of the property to ensure your home is secured and spotlights to confirm your home has been undisturbed. Residents are notified via email after each check is conducted to help reinforce a peace of mind while your family is away from South Russell for business or pleasure. After your return, you will receive a complete report of the house checks from Lieutenant Todd Pocek.

#### **Best Wishes to the Street Commissioner on his Retirement**



At the end of September, we will say farewell to Tim Alder, the Village's Street Commissioner, who will be retiring after 25 years of service. Tim was hired in 1999 as a Driver/Operator for the Service Department under the former Street Commissioner, Darrell Johnson. Previously, Tim spent 12 years with First Energy. When he started with the Street Department, the crew consisted of Marty Denku, Ted Holt, and Tim. The job

was not without its adventures. Tim shared that on one occasion, the department received a call about a turtle in the roadway on Mapleridge Rd. On arrival, they found that the snapping turtle in question was no less than 20 pounds. They managed to wrestle the creature into a cage in the back of the truck for transport to a pond in a neighboring development. However, when they arrived, they found that the turtle had escaped the cage and was crawling around free in the back of the truck. Through no small effort, the wayward reptile was ultimately apprehended and released into a more suitable habitat.

On the retirement of Darrell Johnson in 2019, Tim was appointed Interim Street Commissioner and ultimately as Street Commissioner in 2020. One of his main goals in the position was to replace the older equipment in the department like a backhoe from 1974 and a 1988 International plow truck. As Street Commissioner, he was directly involved in the Village's stormwater mitigation efforts which included the Central Retention Basin, the Manor Brook Stream Restoration project, major culvert replacements on both Bell Rd. and Chillicothe Rd., cleaning of the Bel Meadow ditch, cleaning of the Federated Family Life Center retention pond, and countless driveway culvert pipe replacements, all of which helped to alleviate flooding problems for Village residents.

Reflecting on his career, Tim shared that what he has enjoyed and will miss the most are the people; the residents, co-workers, vendors, etc. When it came to the Senior Trash Pickup events, Tim's philosophy was "we'll get you taken care of," for residents who worried they had not made the pickup list. Tim admitted that what he would not miss was the politics, paperwork, plowing the roads in the middle of the night, and being awakened at all hours of the weekdays and weekends for weather emergencies. For the first snowfall of his retirement, Tim advised that his plan is to sit inside and watch it out the window!

#### **Fall Leaves**

The Village of South Russell does not offer curbside leaf collection service. If you see leaves at the street in your neighborhood, they were most likely put there by a privately hired landscaping company that will be back to pick them up. Leaves brought to the roadside by residents or landscapers must remain on the property and off the roadway. Residents should make sure that leaves are cleared and do not block storm drains, driveway culvert pipes, and ditches which could cause backups and flooding issues during heavy rains.

### **Shredding Day November 2nd!**

Now is the time to start digging out and bagging up all of the old bills, bank statements, and tax returns. The Village will be holding its annual Shredding Day on November 2nd from 9:00 a.m. until noon on the Village campus. Protect your financial and personal privacy by securely disposing of documents containing sensitive information.

#### Election Day is November 5, 2024

The Village of South Russell will have a renewal levy on the November 5th ballot. A levy renewal maintains but does not increase taxes. The Safety Levy is a renewal of a 2.75 mill levy for 5 years and is used for current operating expenses of the Police Department. It brings in approximately \$425,000 per year to the Village and costs the taxpayers about \$51 per \$100,000 of the county auditor's appraised value.



#### **News from the South Russell Police Department**

#### Watch Out for South Russell Village's New Crosswalk!

South Russell Village is excited to announce the upcoming installation of a new crosswalk connecting South Russell Village Park and Alderwood Trail! The crosswalk will be in a north/south direction across Bell Road, with termination points in the South Russell Village Park parking lot (South) and west corner of Bell Road and Alderwood Trail (North).

The crosswalk will feature Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons, or "RRFBs," to notify eastbound and westbound vehicle traffic on Bell Road to yield to pedestrians using the crosswalk. These flashing beacons will be affixed to poles with yellow Pedestrian Crossing signs on both sides of the street. Pedestrians will be able to activate the RRFB at either side by pressing the activation button. The lights on the RRFBs will continue to flash while pedestrians cross safely to the other side.


As always, we ask our residents and visitors to exercise good judgment and safe street crossing practices while using the crosswalk. Here are a some tips as a reminder:

- 1. Stop, look, and listen after activating the crosswalk signal to see if oncoming vehicle traffic is nearby.
- 2. Do not cross the street until oncoming vehicles have come to a complete stop.
- 3. Make eye contact with drivers to ensure drivers see you!
- 4. Be prepared for new oncoming traffic to approach in the opposite direction.
- 5. Keep your heads up and smart devices down! Remove headphones or earbuds to make sure you are completely alert to your surroundings.


We expect this exciting new project to be complete in the first quarter of 2025.




#### **GUIDELINES:**

- NO liquids, paints, hazardous household chemicals, construction debris, rocks, yard waste, or household garbage.
- Mattresses and upholstered furniture must be wrapped in plastic and taped securely to prevent possible bed bug transfer.
- ONLY 10 household items per home.
- Limit of 4 tires (off rims) permitted as well as appliances, electronics, etc.
- Items should be consolidated (in boxes), and placed outside in the driveway (NOT Curbside).

#### FROM THE MAYOR

#### **Projects for 2024**

The Village is researching the removal and replacement of our present salt dome and a possible solar panel array.

The park received additional drainage to remove water that flowed between the parking lot and the playground. Behind the playground we will install a wetlands to capture water flowing down the hill. Eagle Scout candidate Jack Overman will be installing a kiosk about the Interurban Railway that runs through the middle of the park. On the East Washington side of the park we installed a solar-lighted flagpole, a gift from the Chagrin Falls Mason Temple, in honor of member David Toole. This summer will see a bench, plaque and brick walkway to complete the project.

Rarick Cemetery will receive much-needed landscaping and a railing along the steps from Bell Road.

Safety enhancement projects being discussed in 2024 are crosswalks across Bell Road at Gurney School and from Alderwood to the park. Paths and sidewalks continue to be discussed but there will be no construction in 2024.

The Veterans event on Monday, November 11<sup>th</sup> at The Sleepy Rooster will be a breakfast at 9:00 a.m.

The tax deadline for individual Municipal income tax returns is April 15, 2024. All residents 18 years of age and older are required to file an annual return with the Central Collection Agency (CCA). Local income tax withheld by your employer does NOT fulfill your obligation to file a tax return.

Retired residents are required to file the Annual Exemption Certificate each year. This form is available online through ccatax.ci.cleveland.oh.us as well as at South Russell Village Hall and on the homepage of the Village website, southrussell.com.


#### **Harvest for Hunger**

Registrants receive email notifications each time an officer checks on their home and a complete summary upon their return.


Residents can note in the "Comments" section if other people, like cleaners, contractors, or pet sitters will be visiting the home while they are out of town.

#### Rules Regarding Door-to-Door Soliciting





standpoint, the US Supreme Court ruled that door-to-door soliciting is a freedom of speech issue, and therefore is legal. While this is the case, there are some limitations placed on the solicitors, to include the Ohio's Home Solicitation Sales Act of 2021 which provides the following consumer protection:

- If the consumer cancels, the seller must provide a refund within 10 days.

Other ways for residents to protect themselves include posting "No Soliciting" signs on their property. However, this cannot be posted for an entire village, subdivision, or street, and can only be done individually by each resident on his/her own property.

Although it is not required, the Village encourages solicitors to get a permit through the Police Department. Solicitors who have taken this step will have a lanyard displaying the permit.

#### **New Alcohol Policy** South Russell Village Park Pavilion

At the May 13th meeting, Council discussed prohibiting alcohol at the South Russell Village Park pavilion effective January 1, 2025. The matter is pending the passage of legislation, but the catalyst for the proposed change pertains to the Village's insurance coverage. Alcohol consumption is already prohibited in the remainder of the park.

#### Park Burn

A burn is being considered in the South Russell Village park. It will be similar to the type conducted by the Geauga Park District in Frohring Meadows Park. The park will be divided into five or six sections with only part of the park being burned each year. The purpose of the burn is to remove invasive plants that have established themselves in the park.

#### Miscellaneous Park News

The park received additional drainage to remove water that flowed between the parking lot and playground. The area behind the playground will have another wetland established to catch, hold, and clean water that flows down the hill towards Bell Rd.

Discussions and exploration continue for a permanent restroom at the park.

#### **Summertime Safety**



School is out! With college students returning and K-12s spending more time at home, expect to see increased play and vehicle activity on neighborhood streets! Please look out for children playing in the

street and be mindful of local speed limits and traffic control devices. We want all families of the Village of South Russell to have a fun and safe summer!

#### Yard Maintenance

Summer and the growing season are here! Section 678.01(a) of the Codified Ordinances of the Village of South Russell requires that residents keep property free and clear from all noxious weeds and rank vegetation and, where a grass lawn exists, keep the average height of the grasses of said lawn to no greater than eight inches at all times. When there is a violation, the Village notifies the resident via mail and if the grass is not cut, a landscaper is hired to mow

#### Crosswalks

Based on resident input, Council has explored the installation of crosswalks across Bell Rd. at Alderwood Dr. to the

South Russell Village Park and another at Gurney Elementary School.
